

Idiom

THE modern choral idiom used by the better radio choruses but unavailable heretofore in published arrangements is used in this new series. In close parallel harmony the voice parts roll along in an artistic but carefree manner. Voices imitate sounds and enjoy a flexibility and elasticity lacking in choruses of more rigorous routine character. The use of the seventh chord in moderation colors the music in the manner often heard in radio production.

Soprano-Baritone Choruses-No. 37

There is no range problem in the easy harmonic progressions of the modern settings in this book. Each part is tuneful; the effects are novel and interesting. There is wide variety among the ten numbers. Price: 25 cents.

THREE-PART CHORUSES FOR MALE VOICES-No. 44

Here is he-man music, the kind every boys' or men's chorus wants in its repertoire. Each selection is interesting to sing and is fun to rehearse. Tenors do not go above top line f nor basses below first line g. Price: 25 cents.

THREE-PART CHORUSES FOR TREBLE VOICES-No. 50

An attractive collection with melodies set in up-to-theminute harmonies. The variety of content, the frequent appearance of the melody in a lower voice part, the refreshingly modern accompaniments, and the clever use of imitation produce some unusually effective results. Price: 25 cents.

Brahms Choruses for Treble Voices-No. 51

This book features the particularly important "Song .n Ossian's Fingal". It also includes the piquant "Beware!" which is in lighter vein, and five other selections. All are in their original settings for SA, SSA, SSAA, or three equal voices. Price: 25 cents.

FIVE MASTER CHORUSES (MIXED VOICES)—No. 58

In this volume are five of the world's greatest choruses by masters of choral writing. They are not difficult; they may be done well by high school choruses. Two of the numbers have both Latin and English texts. Pergolesi, Bach, Handel, Mozart, and Verdi are represented. Price: 25 cents.

The School Music Conductor

Dr. Wilson collaborated with Dr. Paul Van Bodegraven in giving you successful solutions to many of the problems in choral and instrumental conducting. There are numerous vital chapters on score reading, successful rehearsal procedures, how to present well-balanced programs; in brief, how to build a good up-and-coming musical organization. Used as a text in teacher-training classes or as an individual guide. Price: \$2.00.

Songs We Sing

With Fowler Smith and Glenn H. Woods, Dr. Wilson produced this outstandingly successful book for classroom, assembly and recreational gatherings. Every song is fun to sing and a pleasure to hear. A distinctly modern touch is felt in many of the numbers. All may be done in unison, but the majority have two or more parts—not difficult parts but counter melodies, descants and harmonizations which are easy and natural. Price: 25 cents.

Songs of the Hills and Plains

Early American songs selected for their singability and arranged for modern use in the classroom, the home, and camp. These favorites of the American pioneers, mountaineers, and cowboys are equally suitable for both amateur and professional choral groups.

To the melodies have been added occasional parts, descants, and colorful but easy piano accompaniments which retain the flavor of the early versions. There are specific suggestions for singing the songs and for dramatizing some of them. A valuable feature of the book is a group of playparty songs with directions for dances. Price: 60 cents.

Rounds and Canons

Included in this book is an unusual and extensive collection of rounds. Some are familiar and many are new ones published for the first time. Suggestions are given in connection with each number. They will help you bring out some surprisingly interesting effects. Besides the 20 familiar rounds and 20 new ones, there are 16 excellent canons and four rounds in full length concert arrangements. These numbers are popular with choral groups because they give the singers a most satisfying musical experience with a minimum amount of rehearsal. Price: 60 cents.

The Modern Choral Hour

Dr. Wilson and Van A. Christy combined their talents in producing this excellent group of 56 part songs. Suitable for junior high school, yet worthy of senior high and adult use. A wealth of musical, singable and attractive material within comfortable vocal ranges and providing a permanent program repertoire. Price: 40 cents.
